



## **Fukushima**

a commentary from

**Q: Could you comment on the Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear power plant and what this means for Japan as well as what this means for humanity?**

Decisions were made to build the plant. Decisions have consequences. Decisions on how to share or not-share the resources of Mother Earth have consequences. These are humanity's decisions, they are not Japanese decisions.

Voices of humanity speak up about nuclear power and voices of humanity override the speakers. And alternatives are sought and alternatives are ignored or decided against or research is not funded. Decisions. *Decisions.*

And some very brave souls are willing to sacrifice themselves to call attention to the choices that humanity makes.

This is not a Japanese problem and that is beginning to dawn. This is humanity's issue. Humanity has made this decision over and over and over. Humanity has had examples of the consequences. If those making the decisions understood the concept of Oneness<sup>1</sup>, if those making the decisions even remotely understood the fact that what goes on down the block, in the next county, in the next country, across the ocean – if those making the decisions understood Oneness, if they truly understood that they cannot possibly escape Oneness....

They can ignore Oneness. They cannot escape it. If they knew this, decisions might be made differently. The decisions are humanity's. The consequences are humanity's. If humanity does not like the consequences, then it is time to consider better decisions, more healthful decisions, decisions that acknowledge the Oneness of which humanity is part. The Oneness that cannot possibly, in any way, be escaped.

Decisions have consequences. Always.

That is my comment. It is not a Japan issue. It is a humanity issue.
