



Inner Plane Advocacy System And Life Plan Shifts

Advocate – someone who will step in and speak for another. What does that have to do with spiritual life? Well, for one thing, it is important to understand that, as a soul, you may *be* an advocate and as a soul you may *have* an advocate. Why is this?

Because at this point in time – as humanity goes through this spiritual maturing, this shift – there will undoubtedly be changes in more life plans than in any time in recent or even distant history.

As the song says, the times they are a changing, and everyone incarnate and discarnate will be forced to respond to these changes. An advocacy system helps make that response more livable, more useable, more reasonable and better for the entirety of the Oneness, the energy system in which we live.

Yes, there are those advanced souls who are incarnate, particularly who are voluntarily incarnate, who do a lot of work on the inner planes. Advocacy might very well be part of that work, because they bring a unique perspective gathered from their incarnate lives and that unique perspective is very useful on the inner planes where a different kind of work can be done and different sorts of influences can be exerted for the benefit of all.

Advocates And Shifting Plans

Advocates are closely related to guides. An advocate can work with your soul or with your guides, or with another soul or another soul's guides – all on your behalf. Your advocate might be a related soul. Perhaps another one in your soul group –

Have I explained soul groups?

Soul groups – those groups of souls that will tend to work together over time. That’s a close enough definition for the purpose of this paper.

Perhaps the advocate is one in your soul group who steps forward and, based on their experience, or what they are currently experiencing with you – or if they are discarnate, what it is they can see by perhaps being close to you – they will make suggestions. They address suggestions to your soul, suggestions, for example, about contract alterations.

Change may be needed because of unexpected free will decisions in response to rapidly changing conditions. Guides cannot influence all decisions of all people between the beginning and the end of an incarnation. The unexpected can happen. So there are advocates.

It is a position that must be fulfilled with objectivity, with wisdom, with loving compassion. An advocate must have big-picture objectivity. For instance, a good advocate maintains a closeness and awareness of happenings in a different soul group or something being planned in another area that the soul of the incarnate person simply is not focused on. Yes, souls have awareness, but not all souls see all things at all times, not before they are ascended and even then it does not happen.

So an advocate may come in and say, “Look, we really need Person ABC to help a large section of the country recover after that last earthquake-typhoon-flood. It’s important. Could we change a few things in that plan?” That kind of advocacy.

Plans change. Plans are rearranged. It happens. And that is where a good, broad-visioned advocate who is wise and loving and compassionate can be of assistance to a guide, can be of assistance to a soul.

Speaking to Your Guides

Your guides are responsible for assisting your soul with keeping you – the incarnate individual – aligned to soul purpose, soul contracts. Advocates can make suggestions to your guide – suggestions about their approach as well as about your agreed-upon plan.

If your advocate senses that one of your guides is being – well a new guide, for instance, might be less effective than an experienced guide and might be taking an ineffective approach to the incarnate individual. This is not by intent, of course. No one who is guiding another and takes the responsibility seriously is going to do anything other than their very best and their truest effort to help this person.

However, due to any number of things – energy relationships, energy incompatibility, a difference in experiences – particularly with a new guide, an adjustment in approach might be appropriate. Or it could be the other way around.

If one is being guided by a relative, the relationship might be too close and the guide might be – I would call it slipping, slipping into the sense of an incarnate relationship and losing track of the wisdom and the perspective they gained once they transitioned and are on our side of the divide.

Suppose you are incarnate and your deceased grandfather is your guide. And let's say your grandfather is not a particularly experienced guide, but was assigned because of the close relationship. Your soul felt this grandfather might have great influence in keeping things on track, but the grandfather succumbs too much to grandfatherly feelings and is not as objective as is needed to keep you aligned with your contract.

An advocate, perhaps a more experienced guide from your soul group, may step in and speak to the guide who is your grandfather and offer suggestions.

Speaking Directly to Your Soul

An advocate can also be one who speaks to the soul. In this case, chances are the advocate is definitely an experienced guide, if not an Ascended Master or someone who has ascended. This advocate might suggest to the soul that a contract needs to be modified.

Suppose, for instance, in between-life planning the soul realized it was taking a risk and it set up Plan A and Plan B. But now, the soul itself has become too focused on Plan A, not moving to Plan B when that simply makes more sense. The advocate might try to convince the soul

to let Plan A go so that guides can begin nudging the incarnate person towards Plan B.

Decisions Rest With The Soul

Advocates only deal with the soul and with the guides of the incarnate person. Advocates do not deal with the incarnate person directly. The decision to say yes or no to an advocate – for whatever reason the advocate has approached the guide or the soul – the decision rests with the soul as to whether a plan will be modified a small bit, a large bit, or not at all. The soul has final approval. That must be clear.

Advocacy in Between-Life Planning

In between-life planning Soul Y may say, "This experience must be part of my upcoming life." *This experience* – say balancing past-life arrogance with a sudden business collapse that leads to bankruptcy – may involve many employees. An advocate for Soul D in the employee group might speak up. "Your timing threatens an international project Soul D is scheduled to complete in this life. We need Soul D stationed in such-and-such country and this collapse you're planning makes that unlikely." Negotiations begin.

Continuity With Flexibility

Contract alterations and between-life planning are all part of continuity of consciousness and soul evolution. Flexibility is important, yet losing sight of the ultimate life objective is not acceptable. So there must be flexibility while keeping track of where it is you are going.

One could call it flexibility within a rigid structure because the ultimate purpose is a reunification with the Divine. That does not change. Within that structure for soul evolution, flexibility is important.

Some incarnations are more flexible than others.

- Let us say that the objective of an incarnation – the focus for experience – is community building. Community building within the city, the neighborhood, the town – whatever the local community group. This is a community building effort, the knock-on-door, know-your-neighbor, work-with-your-neighbor, coordination effort to build a community.

- This may be a very important learning experience for the soul and a benefit to the community involved, but there is flexibility here. Who is included, when this is done, how this is done. There may be great flexibility with the same objective of community building.
- An advocate for another soul will likely have room to negotiate for plan modification.

Some incarnations have little room for flexibility.

- Let's say that the purpose of this incarnation is to become a well-known, world famous artist. (Now when I say artist I do not necessarily mean painter. It could be a musician, an actor, a very clever, a very advanced director.)
- World-famous art does not just emerge. It is planned. In order for this person to attain the influence and be positioned, there is very limited flexibility about when the art must start, who the artist must meet, what patrons must be there at what time in order for this artist to emerge on the scene at the right time and have the necessary influence to deliver the message that we want delivered through that art.
- In this case, an advocate for another soul wishing a plan modification may have a very difficult task in store.

Advocates in Perspective

Souls, particularly within a soul group, watch out for each other. Soul groups network with other soul groups. As souls watch out for each other, one may very easily become an advocate for another.

Now, when an advocate approaches a guide, the advocate will be listened to, and motives at this level are important. If the advocate is respected and has the objectivity and the wisdom and the loving intent, then there's a chance the advocate will be heeded. It is also possible that there are some self-serving motives going on.

If you think that once you transition all discarnate entities are pure loving and free from self-serving motives, well you're in for a shock. But we shall go into the various levels on the disincarnate side of the continuum in another paper, not this one.

Advocacy is a function and various entities – including angels – can effectively become advocates for one reason or another. So you see, we have a very busy, very active realm.
